WWF's Green Ambassadors Plant2Plate Recipe Competition

Terms and Conditions

- 1. The competition is open to all UK residents aged 4-11 attending a UK school which is registered on WWF-UK's Green Ambassadors Scheme.
- 2. No children of WWF staff are allowed to enter.
- 3. A representative of the entrant's school must submit the entry on the child's behalf and by doing so agrees and accepts these terms and conditions.
- 4. All winners will require the consent of their parent or legal guardian to receive their prize. By accepting the prize on the winner's behalf, the school confirms that the child's parent or legal guardian agrees and accepts:
 - I. these terms and conditions:
 - II. that WWF-UK may publish winning entrants' recipes both in print and online, including on its website, on its social media channels and in its Green Ambassadors recipe book;
 - III. that Alpro, the sponsor of the Green Ambassadors schools programme, may publish winning entrants' recipes on its website and for PR purposes;
- IV. that WWF-UK may alter or edit a winning recipe if it deems it appropriate to do so;
- V. that the winning entrants may be invited to participate in publicity arising from this promotion;
- VI. that any personal details supplied will only be used to administer the competition and will not be published or provided to any third party without the explicit permission of the entrant's parent or legal guardian.
- To take part, the child should create a recipe in school cooking classes featuring ingredients grown at the entrant's school. Send the recipe by email to greenambassadors@wwf.org.uk or send it by post to Green Ambassadors Recipe Competition, WWF-UK, The Living Planet Centre, Rufford House, Brewery Road, Woking, Surrey, GU21 4LL.
- 6. The deadline for receiving entries is 5pm on 6 June 2016. Any entries received after this deadline will not be considered.
- 7. Only entries that comply with all entry instructions will be accepted.
- 8. Competition is limited to one entry per pupil. No entrant may win more than one prize.
- 9. Recipes must be the original work of each entrant and not copied from any source.
- 10. The judging panel will select 50 winning recipes from all entries received by the competition deadline. Key things the panel will be looking for are recipes which are good for the planet and for people, and which produce good technical results.

- 11. The first prize is £1000 for the winning entrant's school to be spent on gardening or cooking equipment. This equipment is to be used to encourage sustainable cooking habits. The top three winners (including the first prize winner) will each be awarded a WWF adoption pack. All remaining winners will receive a printed copy of the recipe book and a certificate of appreciation.
- 12. The decision of the panel is final. No correspondence will be entered into.
- 13. In the event of unforeseen circumstances WWF-UK reserves the right to substitute any of the prizes for an alternative of equal or greater value.
- 14. The top fifty winners will be contacted by email via their school within 30 days of the closing date. The winning schools must claim their prize within 14 days of the notification. If the winners cannot be contacted after reasonable further attempts have been made, WWF-UK reserves the right to offer the prize to another entry selected in accordance with the promotion rules.
- 15. WWF-UK reserves the right to cancel this competition without notice at any stage if it is deemed necessary at the absolute discretion of WWF or where events beyond its control prevent proper administration of the competition.
- 16. These terms and conditions and any disputes arising out of them shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law.
